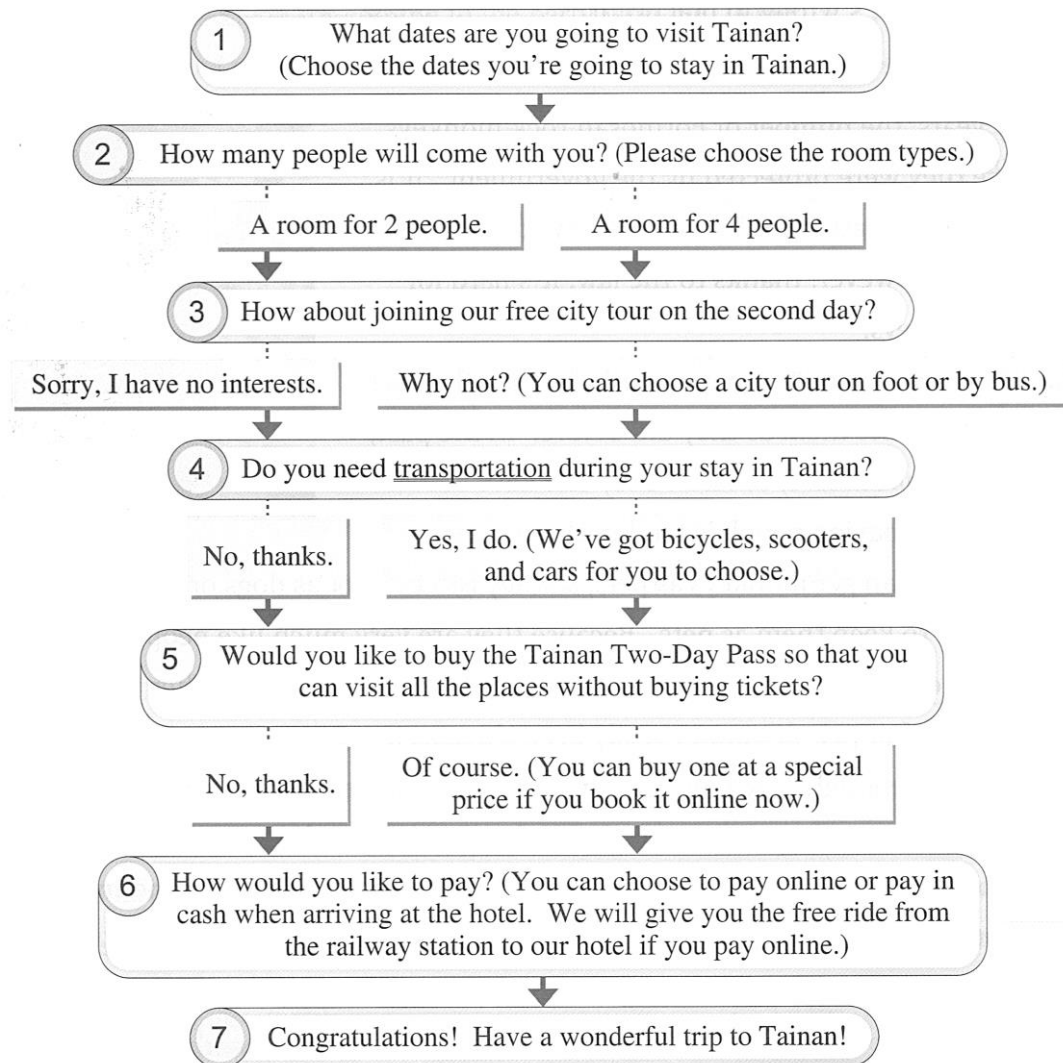

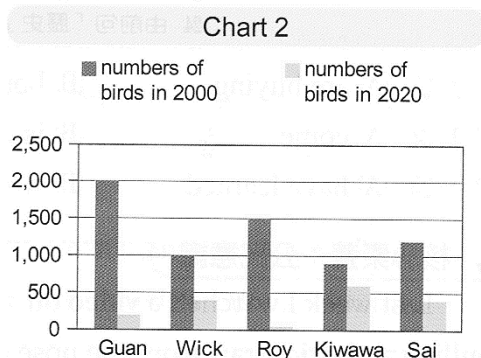
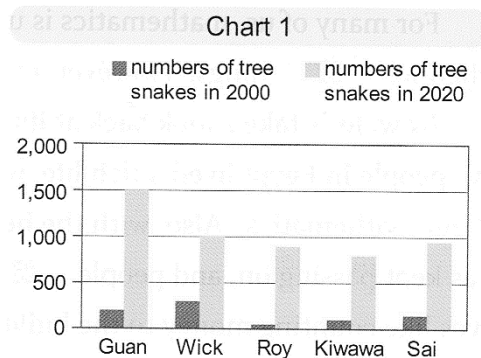

In chart 1, we can see that the number of the tree snakes grows fast in the 20 years. In chart 2, we can see that there are not as many birds as before.
