





[E] To Experience the Joy of Buying Products Without Going out

Since the epidemic in Taiwan in May in 2021 became more serious, people have seldom gone out to eat in restaurants. Food can only be taken out from the restaurants or sent to customers' homes. Business is getting worse and worse. Many small restaurants close their doors. What can small shops do to face the epidemic?

In fact, in 2020, the American Restaurant Association said the restaurants lost 2.5 million jobs. Reading books in a small corner of a bookstore, drinking wine at a bar, and shopping in a store are all the things that can't be done in the daily lives of Oklahoma City and that makes businesses close their doors.

"The epidemic makes us lose the right of shopping together," said Layne Ferguson, who is the co-founder of Capital Ice Cream in America. He works with three other founders to choose a way for people to experience the joy of buying their favorite products at home without going out. They called on more than a dozen businesses to work together to offer several special products and make "City Boxes". They are pizzerias, bookstores, coffee shops, beverage shops, planting shops, and bakeries. For example, "Romantic Date Night" has drinks, pizza, ice cream buckets and candles. People can buy more than one business product at a time through Internet. More than 1,500 gift boxes were sold in the first month. [F] "NFT," the Next Big Thing in the Digital World

If you are interested in artwork, you may hear of NFTs. Although NFTs have been around since 2014, they become a popular way to buy and sell digital artwork now. And after the first-ever NFT artwork called "Everydays: The First 5,000 Days" was sold for \$69.4 million, NFTs have quickly swept through the world of digital art.

There has long been a problem for artists to make digital works of art because they can be copied easily. And this makes it hard for the artists to sell their works. However, NFTs can help fix the problem. NFTs stand for non-fungible tokens. An NFT uses the technology of blockchain to make something that is one of a kind in the digital world. But unlike a painting, which can be placed in the owner's home, an NFT is a digital certificate saying you own the artwork. While there may be many copies of the painting in the world, only the person who buys the NFT gets the certificate. Only he has it. Nobody else in the

world can have it.

It's not just art that's being sold with NFTs. Some bands are making music with NFTs. Besides, NFTs can be anything like drawings, photos, and videos. Many people believe that NFTs will be the next big thing in the digital world.
