Toys are items that are made to bring joy but often become trash when a child's interests change. With more and more trash hurting the Earth, some toy makers think the best way to fix this problem is to build a circular economy



for toys. For example, LEGO makes its first step by inviting people to pass on bricks they aren't using to kids who need them the most. By giving the used bricks a new life, people not only give thousands of kids the chance to learn through play but also help cut the number of bricks thrown away.

Besides, Happy Baton's service allows toys to be used again by more people. Every month, families who sign up for its service can have a box of toys sent and swapped, so the learning and fun never end! Dagoma is another business joining the circular economy. It helps fix broken toys by using 3D printing. Dagoma

builds a library of 3D print files of commonly lost or broken toy parts and allows people to download the files to 3D print at home for free.

While the above ways help keep toys we have in use for a longer time, whether toys are made to be made again also plays an important part in a circular economy. Therefore, many businesses are looking for new recycled materials to make sure both their toys and packaging won't trash the Earth.

Have you seen one like this? It is not a bird or an airplane. It is a drone, an unpiloted aircraft.



With drones becoming more popular, their price has <u>plummet</u>ed. They used to cost a lot of money, but you are able to get a simple one for only several thousand NT dollars. You can even buy one for only NT\$1,500 on the Internet when they are on sale.

Drones are sought after by not only players but also businesses. Take Amazon for example. For the past few years, the big company has been testing a new way to deliver packages by using drones. The "octocopters," Amazon's drones, can carry things up to 2.3 kg. They are able to get packages to customers in only 30 minutes. In some ways, they are more earth-friendly than trucks because they do not need gas. Also, they are sometimes faster since the traffic in the sky is much less busy than that on the roads.

However, there are some worries about delivering things with drones. For example, the drones might make too much noise, which will be troubling. What's more, if the drones are out of order, they may not work well or safely. So, it might take a few more years before the sky is packed with delivering drones.
