



Antarctica is the southernmost continent on the planet, and its name comes from a Greek word meaning opposite to the north. Surrounded by the Southern Ocean, it is home to the South Pole, is almost twice the size of Australia, and experiences months of complete daylight as well as darkness. Most of Antarctica is covered by a sheet of ice that averages about two kilometers in thickness, which also makes up around 90% of the world's ice. To put it simply, that's about 70% of the Earth's supply of fresh water. What's more, if <u>it</u> were to melt, it would raise sea levels by 60 meters.

Unlike the other continents, Antarctica is the coldest, driest, and windiest place on Earth. In 1983, it was recorded as having the coldest temperature in history, -89.2 degrees Celsius, and its average yearly temperature is -49.5 degrees Celsius. Since the continent experiences very little rainfall, only 10 centimeters each year, it is considered a desert.

While humans don't live in Antarctica permanently, other animal species do. These include blue whales, fur seals, krill, and several types of penguins.

By 2025, Copenhagen, Denmark wants to be carbon neutral, which means it will stop adding extra CO2 into the air.

How do they plan to do this? To start, the city is doing things like trading in its old buses for new electric ones. Today, just over half of their buses are electric, but in five years, all of them should be. Since 27% of people there use public transportation, this will help a lot.


Bikes are another important part of Copenhagen's plan. The government has even built special roads for them. It is the best place to bike in the world right now. Hundreds of thousands of people in the city bike to work or school every day. More people there actually use bikes rather than cars or public transportation.


There is one thing that has been difficult for Copenhagen. While only 25% of people use cars in the city, the amount of nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, and other pollutants these cars have produced still result in a very large amount of air pollution. So the government has been helping these people buy electric cars. They are also spending a lot of money on clean energy that releases less or no CO2 to power these cars. Even with that, however, only 20% of cars in Copenhagen are electric.

Still, if Copenhagen meets all of its goals, it will be the first major city to be carbon neutral. For the health of our planet, let's hope it can.



Although hunting for whales was banned in 1966 by the International Whaling Commission (IWC), countries like Japan and Norway continue to do so. To avoid the rules, these countries kill whales for scientific purposes. This is something that the IWC allows. In fact, the meat is still sold and eaten in these countries.

Even with the rules, only some whales are doing better. The larger kinds of whales are still having a difficult time. Over the past 150 years, the number of blue whales has <u>declined</u> by 70–90%. Today, there are less than 25,000 left. Hunters and pollution are equally responsible for decreasing the number of blue whales. Because of this, we continue to lose more of them every year.

If these whales disappear, it would be a big loss for the planet. Whales are not only marvelous animals but also reportedly able to help fight against climate change. In fact, saving whales may be even more helpful than planting trees.




