#### About Being Left-Handed

Are you right-handed or left-handed? About 90% of people around the world are right-handed. Only a few people use their left hands in daily lives. In some countries, people think badly of left-handers. For example, in China, parents often make their left-handed children use their right hands instead. In their eyes, being left-handed brings bad luck.

However, scientists today have different ideas about being left-handed. They see that the brains and bodies of left-handers work differently from those of right-handers. Left-handers' brains have a strong link to the language area, so they may have better **verbal skills** than right-handers. In one study, left-handers always came up with new ideas and were usually team leaders, too. Leonardo DaVinci, Steve Jobs, Bill Gates, and Mark Zuckerberg were or are all left-handers.

Why are some people left-handed? A study in New England found that mothers over 40 may be more likely to have left-handed babies. Also, babies with a low birth weight have a higher chance of being left-handed. No one can really explain it clearly. But according to scientists, genes may be responsible for it about 25% of the time.

Wu-chung Hou was born in Penghu in 1963. After graduating from Kaohsiung Medical University as a doctor, he chose to go back to his hometown. He started to work in Penghu at the age of 28, and he soon found a problem.

Penghu County is made up of a lot of small islands. The only way to move from one island to another is to take a boat ride. However, the strong winds often delayed the rides, so the sick people on the outlying islands had to wait for days to see a doctor. To take care of them, Hou bought a boat and spent half a year learning to navigate it.

Every week, even when the weather was bad, he still traveled by boat to the islands to see sick people. When he arrived, everyone always welcomed him with open arms. "The kindest doctor comes to see us," said one of them.

Sadly, Dr. Hou died of cancer at the age of 55 in 2017. On the day of his funeral, many people went to honor his kind and beloved doctor from Penghu.
