

A lot of people vape because they want to quit smoking. Does it work? Yes, but not always. It would be better to give up both smoking and vaping. However, it is never easy to do.

The answer to the problem of smoking is never to start smoking in the first place. Studies show that people who start smoking at the age of 13 will find it more difficult to quit than those who begin at 21, so it is important for teenagers not to get into the habit of smoking.
