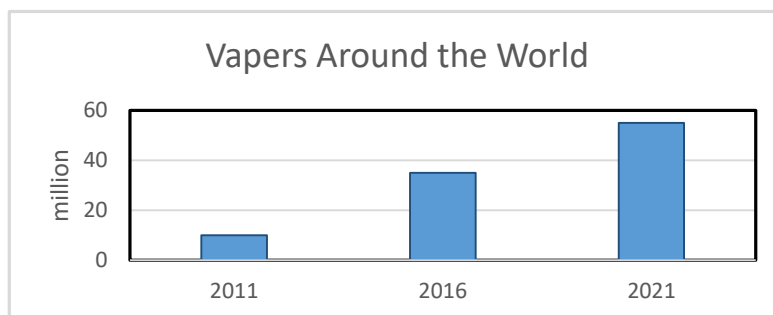

Everyone knows that smoking is bad for health. Those who smoke a lot put their health at risk. Worryingly, smoking can damage almost every part of smokers' body, like their heart, lungs, stomach, and even their teeth. However, the question is why so many people are still in the habit of smoking.

One of the worst parts of smoking is that once you smoke, it is hard to quit. Though the number of smokers around the world is getting smaller, that of vapers is on the rise. Since 2011, more and more people have vaped, and the number is going to grow even more in 2021. Look at the picture below.



Why do so many people vape? Is it safer to vape than to smoke? In some ways, vaping does do less damage to smokers' body, but it does not mean that it is 100% safe. A lot of people vape because they want to quit smoking. Does it work? Yes, but not always. It would be better to give up both smoking and vaping. However, it is never easy to do.

The answer to the problem of smoking is never to start smoking in the first place. Studies show that people who start smoking at the age of 13 will find it more difficult to quit than those who begin at 21, so it is important for teenagers not to get into the habit of smoking.
