It's the season for juicy watermelon, fresh strawberries, and baskets of blueberries. The next time you enjoy a bite of delicious fruit, thank honeybees. Without them, you wouldn't be able to enjoy these sweet treats. And that's what scientists have been worrying about. Since 2006, billions of honeybees all over the world have been dead. Scientists aren't sure what makes bees disappear.

Why are bees so important?

One-third of the fruits and vegetables we eat need honeybees to carry pollen from one plant to another as a **pollinator**. Therefore, if there aren't enough bees to do so, there will be fewer and fewer foods. Then, a food shortage or a large rise in the price of food may happen. Although other pollinators, like butterflies, bats, and wind all help pass on pollen, none do as good of a job as the hardworking bees.

What can be done?

While scientists are working to solve the problem, you can do your part to help bees. Have an adult help you with the ideas below.


- 1. Create a bee-friendly "house" in your yard, or even in a flower pot.

- 4. **Provide a bee bath.** Fill a shallow dish or bowl with some small stones in fresh water.

Quite a few studies have shown that YouTubers have more of an influence on young people than other celebrities such as musicians, movie stars, and sportspeople. These studies also give us some ideas as to the reasons. In a 2015 study, 63% of 13- to 24-year-olds who answered said they would try a product recommended by a YouTuber. Of the same age group, only 48% said they would try one recommended by a TV or movie star. In 2014, a study showed that teenagers aged 13 to 18 considered YouTubers to have more influence than traditional celebrities.

But why is this? One reason is that young people find it easier to understand YouTubers. They seem more like ordinary people than movie stars and are friendlier than celebrities who often only show up at sponsored events. In 2016, a study found that 70% of teenagers who follow YouTube channels said they feel closer to YouTubers than to other celebrities. Another reason is that most YouTubers personally answer comments and chat with their fans. In the same study, 70% of the people felt that YouTubers are the ones who set trends and create culture. It is no surprise that many big companies are now turning to YouTubers to review and recommend their products.
